#### 31 New Exterior Paint Palette Choices

Finally we have color choices! In our February meeting, the Board of Directors approved thirty one new exterior paint palettes in addition to the existing paint palettes. So if it's time to paint your house, the process is easy. Just log onto <u>http://dobsonhoa.com/</u> and then click on the "Painting Your House" button.

From there you can review all of the pre-approved color scheme options, and find out all the specifics about painting your house and the discounts available thru the Community Coalition. You still need to fill out an Architectural Request Form, but Dobson Place has a 1 business day paint color approval process if you select the exact pre-approved color combinations. To receive the one day response, your request must not have any variations from the pre-approved colors. Requests with variations will follow the normal Architectural Change Request process and be reviewed by the Architectural Review Committee.

**Do you want to keep your same exterior house color?** If so, call Standard Pacific Homes at 480-627-7594. When you provide the property address, they will tell you what colors your house was originally painted. Then submit an Architectural Request Form.

Word to the wise: Don't try to match existing paint – You will just end up with sun bleached new paint!

**Do you want to change your exterior house color?** First select a preapproved color scheme or your preferred paint colors. Then submit an Architectural Request Form including the colors you plan to paint, base, body, and any accent colors. If you choose the exact combination from the pre-approved list, approval is next business day. If you choose other colors, be sure your request includes samples of the colors requested.

# Attention Pet Owners: Scoop Your Doggies Poop!

Our community now has eight pet waste stations positioned throughout the community to afford pet owners the convenience of providing plastic bags and waste cans for pet feces disposal. Please help us keep the sidewalks and common areas clean of pet waste while walking your pet. We would also appreciate your filling the bag tubes nearest you with your recycled plastic grocery bags when you notice them getting empty. Trash bags are emptied on a regular basis by the landscape maintenance crew.



Thank you to all who observe the parking rules of Dobson Place. For clarification please be advised that street parking or parking on any landscaped portion of your yard is prohibited per the Dobson Place CC&R's.

Parking in the street hinders trash and recycling removal, street cleaning, and emergency vehicles. Street parking obstructs the view of drivers, putting our children at a great risk of being struck by an oncoming car. Further, by parking your car in the street you are opening yourself up to auto theft and/or vandalism.

Cluttered roadways and parking on your landscaping are a visual eye soar, and our goal is to protect your property value by having an aesthetically appealing neighborhood.

So please be considerate and abide by the CC&R's by parking in your garage and/or driveway. For those times when you may need to park on the street temporarily, please advise the Property Management Company, Renaissance Community Partners in advance to avoid a warning or citation. Let us all work together to make our neighborhood safe and beautiful.

# **Pool Drainage**

It is now required that all spa pool and water discharges be maintained on private property, or in a sanitary sewer clean-out on private property, and not into the street. There is no permit or notification needed. The process is easy and environmentally friendly.

The sewer clean-out is typically a three or four inch black pipe about level with the landscaping, typically located close to the home. It may have a black cap, with a raised square nut or a recessed slot. which can be unscrewed to make way for the hose from the pool to drain the water. In a newer home, you may find that there are two clean-out pipes. In this case, you generally want to discharge into the one closer to the home.
